
Mystery at the Biltmore #2

Before Reading: making your own Investigation Diary

As you read, add details about these key elements to your Investigation Diary to help solve the crime.




During Reading:

- 1. Tiya wants to keep the case 'classified,' or secret. Is this a good idea? Have you ever kept something classified?
- 2. Oscar has added a new talent to his repertoire. What is one special skill you have? Or, what's a special skill you wished you had?
- 3. Elodie has many qualities that make her a good detective. What are three? What qualities do *you* have that would make you a good detective?
- 4. In Chapter 6, Elodie proves that she is a good friend to Oscar. What happens? When is a time someone has been a good friend to you? Or, when have you been a good friend?
- 5. Create Bijou's birthday invitation. What important information needs to be included? Draw a photo of Bijou on the front.
- 6. In Chapter 10, Oscar helps Elodie a few times. Make a list and rank them in order of what was most helpful.
- 7. Plan your ultimate birthday party. Where will it be? Who will be the entertainment? How will you decorate? What will you eat?
- 8. Bijou means jewel in French. Why is this a good name for her? If you had a pet, what would you name them? Why? If you have a pet, how did they get their name?

After Reading:

1. Elodie is reminded to cherish the people she cares about at the end of the book. Based on who you've met in *The Classified Catnapping* (and *The Vanderhoff Heist*, if you read it), make a Circle of Trust. (See example diagram below). Make your own Circle of Trust using the blank template at the end.



- 2. The West Side Spy-der wrote an article to spread rumors about Bijou's disappearance. Write an article that tells the truth, either about the catnapping, or her reappearance. You'll need to include a catchy headline, the 5 W's, and at least one quote from someone involved in the case. Use your investigation diary to help you.
- 3. Rewrite a scene in the book from Bijou's point of view. How would she feel about what is happening? What would she notice?
